

MDOC organizes summer course on Visual Anthropology and Cinema

Taking place between 01 and 06 of August, **Off Screen** has already opened its registration period. The course is based on research projects and digital and audiovisual narratives to propose a debate on the relationship between anthropology and cinema, providing a space for the exchange of ideas and contact between the academic context, professional networks, scientific associations and filmmakers. Running alongside the festival, this summer course is aimed at cultural agents, educators, documentarians and those with a keen interest on the theme of identities. The course is coordinated by José da Silva Ribeiro, member of AO NORTE and ID+. Prices and program can be consulted in detail on the festival's website.

With a body of tutors made up of Portuguese and foreign researchers, **Off Screen 2022** will pay particular attention to issues related to participatory audiovisual methodologies, highlighting the standing of documentary filmmaking and visual anthropology in the creation of new spaces for a critical understanding of reality, capable of deconstructing discourses hegemonically textualized by colonization processes. Also under discussion will be the processes of approximation to communities and the standing of community artistic practices in the field of cinema, as well as the reflection on how the use of audiovisual collections and archives will be able to open new spaces for historical understanding and the connection points between the gazes of anthropologists and filmmakers.

The Off Screen formative program is organized around **Point** and **Counterpoint** moments. At Point, guest speakers will present projects resulting from their own personal research or artistic practice. At Counterpoint, new guests will question, based on their research or practices and experiences, what was previously presented. Off Screen also includes an intensive program day, Hop to Melgaço, which includes the screening of films, guided tours to exhibitions, the Jean-Loup Passek Cinema Museum and the Espaço Memória e Fronteira Museum, as well as moments of camaraderie and conviviality.

Off Screen is an initiative of AO NORTE, through its Digital Film and Narratives Study Group and the ID+ Institute for Research in Design, Media and Culture in collaboration with the Municipality of Melgaço, the National Museum of Ethnology and the Research Network in Audiovisual Anthropology (RIAA), the Universidad Rey Juan Carlos (URJC), the Federal University of Pernambuco (UFPE) and the Recife International Festival of Ethnographic Film.


SAT and SUN 06, 07 AUG Hop to Melgaço
